In response to the changing dynamics of COVID-19 transmission across the United States, and to support CCDPH's efforts to contain the spread of COVID-19, CCDPH has issued the following guidance for anyone coming into suburban Cook County from designated states with a significant degree of community-wide spread of COVID-19. Anyone traveling from a state on the Orange list on this webpage is directed to obtain a negative COVID-19 test result no more than 72 hours prior to arrival in suburban Cook County or quarantine for a 10-day period (or for the duration of their time in suburban Cook County, whichever is shorter).

CCDPH guidance is consistent with the City of Chicago's Travel Order to reduce confusion among people living and working in Cook County. CCDPH's guidance is our recommendation to prevent the spread of COVID-19, but it is not an order and it is not enforceable.
